WORKSHOP OUTLINE:

Inspired by our online exhibition *Sights of Wonder*, we introduce you to Francis Bedford's early photography and his images of the 1862 royal tour. Bedford documented this four-month journey through Egypt, the Holy Land and Greece. We consider how we continue to use photography to make events accessible to others, share stories and create long lasting moments in our lives.

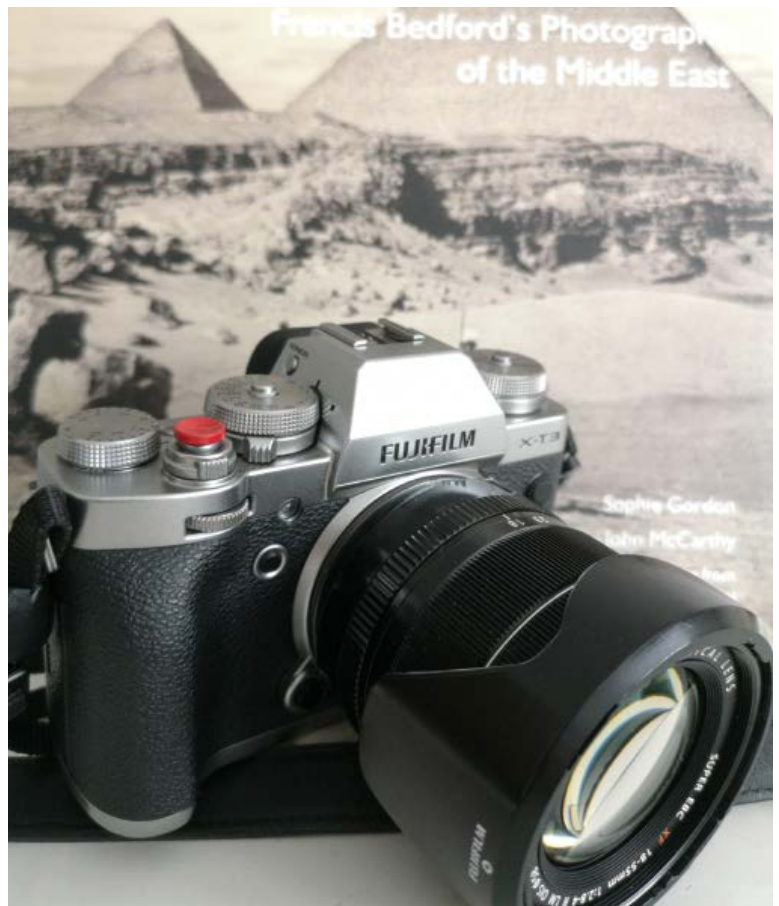
Birmingham photographer Kate Green will host a relaxed and informal conversation about how to take better

photos with your camera or smart phone. She will also share tips on how photography might be used to improve your sense of wellbeing.

Following an introduction to Francis Bedford's photographs, Kate will talk us through understanding how your camera works, working with light and taking sharper pictures, composition techniques, photography for wellbeing and 'doorstep photography' - how to be creative during lockdown. Make sure you have your camera or smart phone to hand during the workshop and, where possible, Kate will assist with settings and queries.

This free online workshop is open to anyone interested in photography but the level of learning is aimed at beginners. It will last roughly one and a half hours including time for conversation and questions.
